Peter Eadon-Clarke, currently Macquarie's Head of Global Economics, joined the firm in March 2004 as Tokyo Head of Research, bringing with him more than 20 years of experience on the buy side, mainly in Tokyo and Hong Kong. Prior to Macquarie, Peter was most recently with UBS Trust and Banking in Tokyo as Chief Investment Officer and functional head of Japanese equities for clients worldwide. Peter's principal publications are *The Global Macro Outlook*, monthly, containing Macquarie's global forecasts, and *Macq-ro insights*, data-rich, topical articles. As Head of Research for the Tokyo office, he created the thematic Hunting Stocks product through which he and the Japan Research team identified and researched individual stock investment opportunities that reflect some of the top-down macro themes drawn from the firm's economics research.

Junko Nishioka, a Chief Economist at Sumitomo Mitsui Banking Corporation, started her career at Industrial Bank of Japan (currently Mizuho financial group) after receiving M.S. Economics at Graduate School of Kyoto University in 2000.

She served as Japan economist for the Bank of Japan (2002-2006), ABN AMRO (2007-2008) and RBS Japan (2008-2014) before joining SMBC in January 2015. Based on her highly reputed research output and presentation in the markets, Ms Nishioka was ranked top ten Economist at Annual Nikkei Veritus survey for 5 consecutive years (#7 for 2010 and 2011 and #6 for 2012 to 2015) polled by major institutional investors in Japan.

Ms Nishioka frequently appears on media for Nikkei news, NHK International, CNBC, Bloomberg news, TV Tokyo to make commentaries on the economy and markets. Nishioka is a member of Ministry of Finance's Advisory Councils on Government Debt Management.
